The excursion will leave from the Marina Inn at 8:30 am and return to the Marina Inn by 3:30 pm.

Take a trip back to pioneer days when buffalo roamed the plains and visit a 480-acre ranch that is home to a herd of 250 bison. Tracing through the native prairie grasses, Indian and Bluestem, guests journey to the center of the bison herd in a covered wagon, where they stop and feed the animals pellets of pressed alfalfa and molasses.

Following the wagon ride, guests will visit the country store and see a spinning demonstration of buffalo fluff. When the dinner bell rings, enjoy a lunch of shredded buffalo roast on a bun, chips, beverage and dessert.

The Dudley Curry Collection

Following the visit to Tarbox Hollow and the excitement of the buffalo experience, we'll continue to the "Dudley Curry Collection." Best described as the greatest collection of "stuff" you could ever imagine, see and photograph acres one man's passion.

One can explore a line of Model-T car bodies that are reminiscent of Stonehenge. See motorcycles, wheels, tires, farm machinery. The list goes on. Spend your time 50 feet from your car, or roam the acres at an easy pace. Bring plenty of film for the day!

Other Photographic Opportunities

Other areas of photographic interest in the Siouxland area

Sioux City Art Center

Designed by the prominent Chicago architectural firm of Skidmore, Owings & Merrill, the building has much to offer Siouxland. Its most striking architectural feature is its three-story glass atrium.

Woodbury County Courthouse

The Woodbury County Court House building consists of Roman brick and granite and is beautifully decorated with sculptures over the doors and on the 157-foot-tall tower rising from the middle of the building. The building is on the National Register of Historic Places.

Riverfront

Beginning in 1991, Sioux City launched an extensive riverfront development program. The beautiful Anderson Dance Pavilion features a covered dance floor and raised band area. Located on the river at Larsen Park Road.

Stone State Park & Nature Center

The Nature Center is located in the unique Loess Hills of western Iowa. The Loess Hills were formed many thousands of years ago by the deposition of windblown soil. Loess deposits of this magnitude are found only in Western Iowa and in China.

Trinity Heights Queen of Peace

The Immaculate Heart of Mary, Queen of Peace, a 30 foot stainless steel statue, joined by The Sacred Heart of Jesus, a 33 foot statue, stand above landscaping and circular walkways with prayer stations. Located on a wooded 53 acres, in the northeast corner of Sioux City, Iowa. Located at 33rd and Floyd.

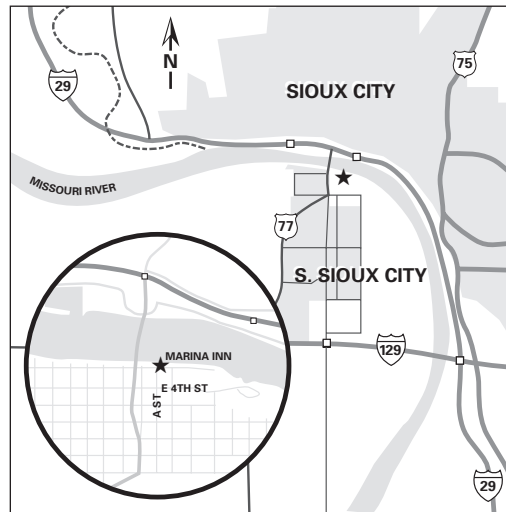
