Fran read a newspaper account that revealed the first camera club was instituted in 1899. However, not a lot of activity is mentioned in print about the club until 1936. Fran, AKA Herkimer, also gave a brief history of N4C and how the SCCC has been intertwined with that organization since it's inception.
