## Windmills across Nebraska

The Center for Rural Affairs invites your community to join us in saluting windmills, with Nebraska's first-ever statewide art and tourism project in 2007.

Winds of Life presents an excellent opportunity for community driven art and cultural projects, which may include painting, sculpture, folk art, drawing, photography, or computer graphics.

Your community may also want to develop a literary project with a windmill theme, which can include poetry, prose, original stories, essays and oral history. Any other type of project will be welcome, just the us know when it will occur.

On the other side of this letter ([Windmill Community Criteria](#)) is a list of community criteria to review. If you would like to participate in this project by hosting a display or sponsoring a windmill, or to incorporate Winds of Life: Windmills across Nebraska into your annual festival, fill out the enclosed entry form.

The sooner you let us know, the sooner we can get the word out about your project.

When you let us know about your project, your community will have its own web page.

You will be included on the map of displays available on the official Winds of Life: Windmills across Nebraska website ([www.windsoflife.com](http://www.windsoflife.com)) and at local tourism information sites.

Nebraska families are encouraged to tour Nebraska with the incentive of viewing every windmill art project, and tourists from other states and counties will have an opportunity to see the beauty of the state as they travel to find the projects.

Community activities will begin June 2007. Outdoor windmill sculptures will be displayed July until October. Winds of Life: Windmills across Nebraska will conclude with an auction in late Fall 2007. Proceeds from auctioning the large sculptures will be divided into three equal parts to the artists, to rural communities for community development, and to the Center for Rural Affairs' Women's Project for Rural America. The goal of the Women's Project for Rural America is to increase activism and advocacy for rural issues, focusing on engaging rural community women in the revitalization of rural America.

## Windmill Community Criteria

Your community is invited to participate in the Winds of Life: Windmills across Nebraska statewide public art and tourism project as an official Windmill Community. Please see the enclosed brochure, community/organization entry form and introductory letter for an overview of this project and the importance to your community's involvement.

To the early settlers the windmill meant life and for Winds of Life: Windmills across Nebraska, the hope is that this project will bring new life to rural Nebraska.

**In order to be designated as a Windmill Community, be included on our tourism guide to Nebraska windmills and have a page on our website, [www.windsoflife.com](http://www.windsoflife.com), we are asking each community to commit to participating in one or more of the events listed in the Community/Organization Entry Form and to have your exhibits open for some portion of each weekend throughout the summer months.**

### Windmills across Nebraska

We encourage you to identify local artisans/writers/storytellers to participate in your events. Also, we ask you to secure local sponsors who will underwrite this project. This money will pay for artist supplies and your project costs. All sponsors will receive recognition in printed materials and on our website with links to their place of business and/or organization.

Each community will decide on the scope of their local events. The Center for Rural Affairs will make a number of selections from each community to be auctioned off in our large state-wide auctions.

After the auction, one-third of the money will go to the artists and the remainder will be part of the CFRA community revitalization fund. Each community will have the opportunity to determine if they wish to sell or have a local auction for the remainder of the exhibit items.

As you work with the organizations within your community we ask that you let them know that all work must be completed by June 1st for indoor exhibits and outdoor windmills or restorations must be completed by July 15.

Again, we encourage you to pull together the talented people of your community to share their skills to make your Windmill Community truly unique. An example would be a joint project with schools, artists, welders or construction specialists.

Also, the use of recycled materials could be interesting as well as a focus on wind turbines and their potential. Of course, individual projects are important for a comprehensive exhibit.

A part of our dream, with appropriate sponsors, is to publish a book about the project with each Windmill Community's story. We will feature your community and participants with pictures and stories. The Winds of Life: Windmills across Nebraska will be a real tribute to the people of Nebraska.
